We are proud to report that we have successfully rescued over 35,000 individuals from slavery since our inception in 2011. Our team has worked tirelessly to provide these individuals and families with the means to rebuild their lives, including good-paying jobs, affordable housing, initial funds for food and necessities, and educational opportunities for their children.

In addition to our rescue efforts, we have also been active in raising awareness about the abuse of blasphemy laws and providing legal assistance to victims. We have also provided healthcare and other support to internally displaced people, and have assisted Pakistani asylum seekers in Thailand.

We are also excited to announce that we have earned a Platinum Seal of Transparency from Candid. This prestigious recognition is awarded to organizations that have demonstrated a strong commitment to transparency and have provided a high level of detail in their nonprofit profile on GuideStar. We believe that transparency is essential to building trust with our donors and supporters, and we are committed to providing detailed information about our mission, programs, finances, and governance.

We are also proud to announce that we have recently implemented new governance and accountability measures, including the formation of an independent audit committee. This will help us to ensure that we are using your donations effectively and efficiently to achieve our goals.

As we move forward, we have ambitious plans to expand our programs and rescue efforts to other countries where slavery is still rampant. Our goal is to eradicate slavery worldwide and to provide comprehensive support to help those who have been rescued to break the cycle of poverty and avoid returning to slavery.

In the coming year, we are aiming to save more than 1,000 individuals from slavery and to save an additional 100,000 families in possible collaboration with the Pakistani government. Redeem the Oppressed is distinct from other organizations that assist persecuted minorities in that our primary goal is to protect them from harm. While other organizations may raise awareness about the persecution, we act to save those in danger. We have encountered other organizations that have refused to assist in life-threatening situations, which is why we rely on donations and support from


individuals like you. You have helped those in need by donating food, shelter, and transportation. We can make a difference and save lives if we work together.

With YOUR Contributions We Have Been Able to Accomplish:

- Providing healthcare to internally displaced people (IDPs) in Khayber Pakhtoon Khawa for six weeks.
- Hundreds of victims were rescued during the 2010 Pakistan floods.
- Campaigning against the abuse of blasphemy laws and providing legal assistance to victims
- Rescuing and reuniting abducted women and girls with their families.
- Over 35,000 people have been successfully freed from slavery, with new jobs, housing, and basic necessities provided, and with local educational charities partnering to provide education for their children.
- Providing food and supplies to Pakistani asylum seekers in Thailand, as well as putting pressure on the UNHCR to schedule refugee status interviews for them.
- For seven months, Pakistani Christians and Ahmadi community members were fed in an immigration detention center in Bangkok.
- Paying off hundreds of asylum seekers' fines to avoid imprisonment
- Bailing out over 70 people who were falsely accused by paying 50,000 Thai Baht per person.
- Relocating George Naz, a high-profile blasphemy victim, to a safe country
- Acquitting the high profile cases of Amanat Masih, Shahzad Masih (Sajid Masih), and Arif Yousaf of blasphemy charges.

Our 2023 Goals Include:

- Building a new village for rescued slaves.
- Providing education and employment opportunities for rescued individuals and their families.
- Aiming to save more than 1,000 individuals from slavery
- Aiming to save an additional 100,000 families in the coming years in possible collaboration with the Pakistani government.



Our organization is fortunate to have a dedicated team of volunteers who generously donate their time and talents to further our mission. As a result, we are able to operate with minimal expenses and no paid staff, including our board members and leadership team. We are grateful for the support of our volunteers, who make it possible for us to carry out our work effectively and efficiently.



Per By-Laws, a maximum of 15% of donations are used for admin/fundraising purposes, so far we have kept that average around 10%


